

Information fact sheet Year 9 2019 and Year 11 2019 Transition to Chev Scholarships

Chevalier College has been serving the local community for over 70 years. In recent times, past students have become very involved with the college and as a result a number of scholarships and bursaries have been established. For 2019, a number of places in Year 9 and Year 11 will be offered to new students as either part or full scholarships.

What is the duration of the scholarships?

The scholarships are for a period of up to four years in the case of Year 9 students and two years in the case of Year 11 students. Further discussions around the length of the scholarships will be held with families when interviewed.

What is a part or full scholarship?

A part scholarship is a reduction in the annual tuition fee of 50%.

A full scholarship is a reduction in the annual tuition fee of 100%.

In what areas are scholarships available?

A number of scholarships are available for each year group (Years 9 and 11) and whilst not set number will be issued in each, students who have talents in any of the following areas are encouraged to apply. (The college may decide to issue more scholarships in one area and fewer in another, depending on applications.)

Are the scholarships means tested?

Scholarships will be awarded based on a review of the talents and skills the student possesses in conjunction with consideration of their family's financial circumstances. However, this does not mean a student whose family has a sound financial situation will not be awarded a scholarship. All aspects of the applications will be considered in order to make a final decision.

How do you apply for a scholarship for Year 9 or Year 11 2019?

Complete the Scholarship Year 9 or the Scholarship Year 11 application form and attach supporting documentation as listed.

Does the application for a scholarship involve an interview?

Yes. Short-listed applicant students and at least one parent/caregiver will be invited to meet with the Principal and Deputy Principal for a 30 minute interview.

When will we know if we have been successful?

We will phone you within three weeks of receipt of an application and follow-up in writing by letter and/or email. .

Does the scholarship cover uniforms, excursions, sport?

The scholarship is applicable to the tuition fee and all that that fee includes such as compulsory excursions and sport. It does not include uniforms, iPads/laptops or voluntary opportunities such as international trips or voluntary excursions.

If I don't get a scholarship can I apply for a place at Chev?

Yes, and there are also limited places in some year groups other than Years 9 and 11 2019. Please contact the enrolment officer – Jenni Woods – for more details.

If my child is offered a scholarship, do I need to fill in other paperwork and do anything else?

Yes. If you are offered a scholarship you will need to complete our Enrolment Acceptance Contract and pay a \$500 enrolment bond. The bond is fully refundable at the end of the student's enrolment less monies owed for such things as books or college equipment borrowed but not returned, or damages to college property caused by the student.

Is there an appeal mechanism if my child is not offered a scholarship?

No. The college makes an assessment based on the information supplied and an interview if short-listed. To offer a scholarship or not is at the discretion of the college and its decision is final.

Are there scholarships for other year groups available?

Not at this stage, however, if financial hardship is preventing you from applying to Chevalier College, we encourage an appointment to be made with the Business Manager or the Principal to discuss possibilities. The college has other fee assistance mechanisms that may be applicable, and which may help a student to join Chev.
